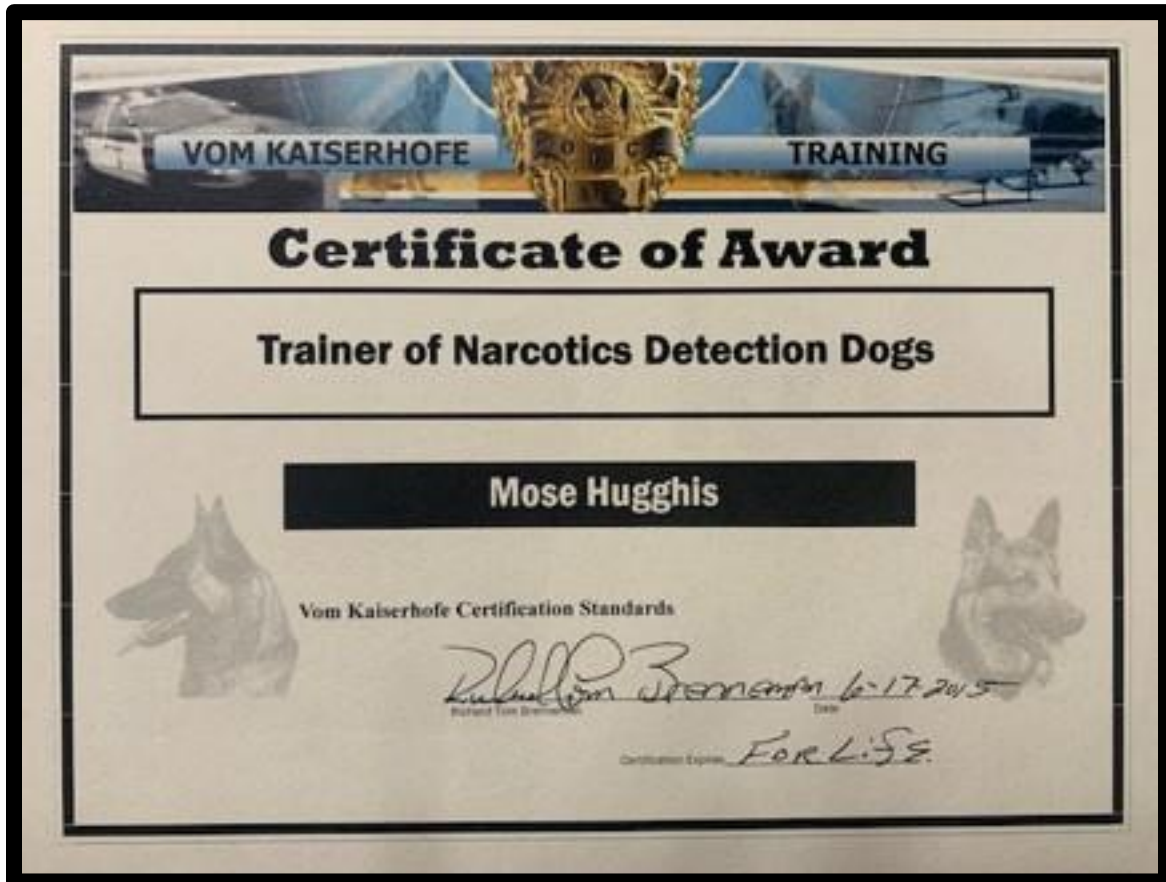
As an expert in raising working dogs, my biggest focus is to build fearless dogs with all the proper drives to do the work needed as a police K9 and survive by skill.

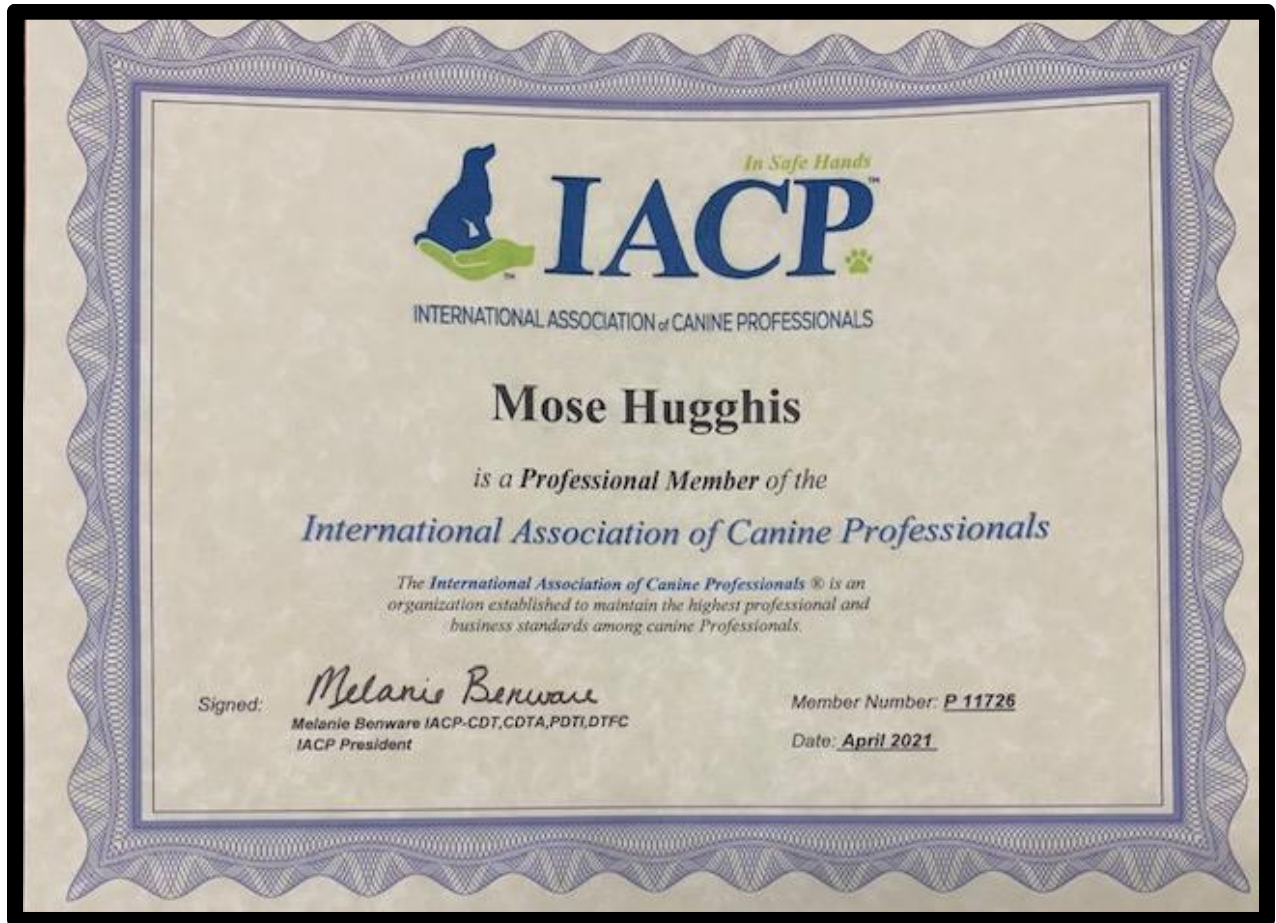

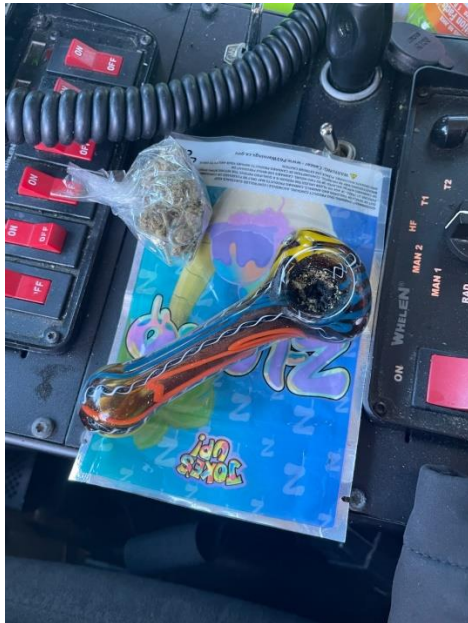
K9 Willie

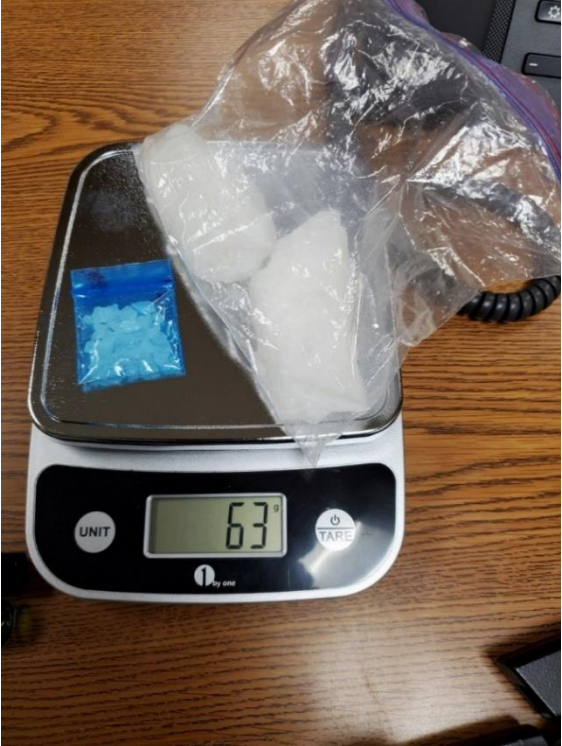

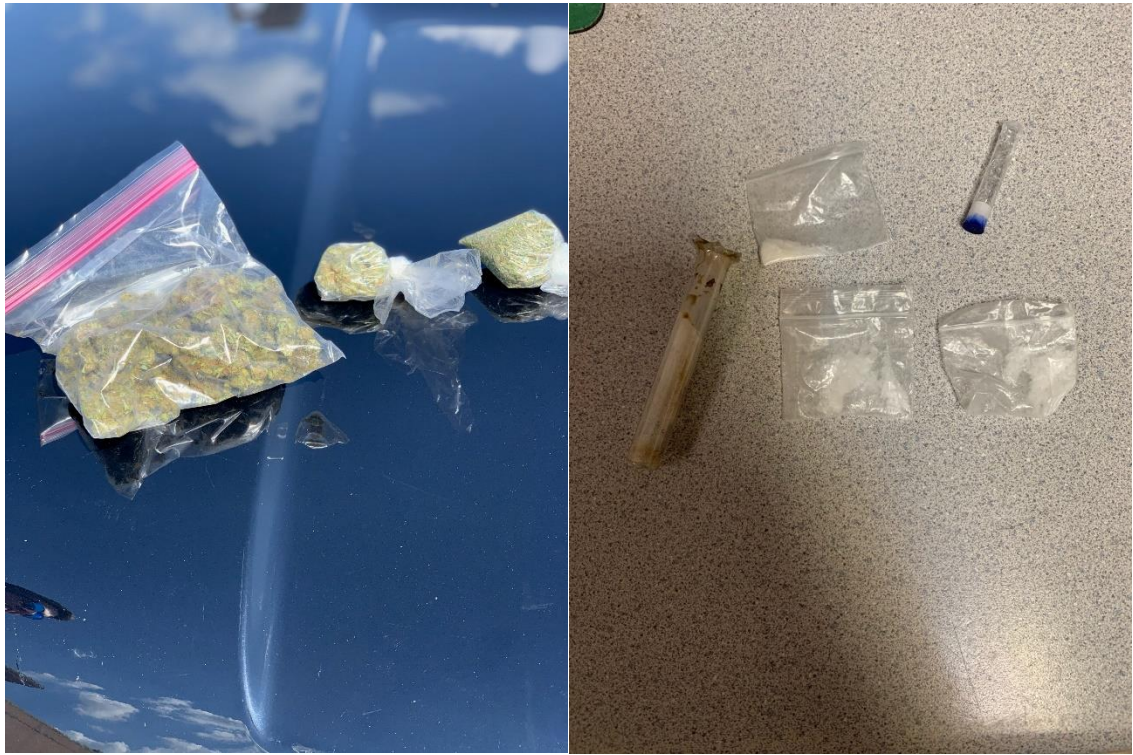

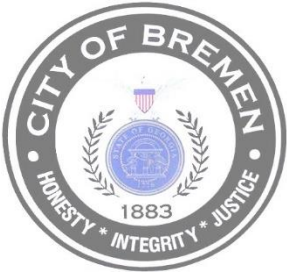

I am Scott McCann, K9 Sgt for the Harper Police Department. I've been a canine handler since 2011, two of the three dogs that I have had come from Mose. The first dog I got from Mose was in 2011 and his name was Jack, a Dutch shepherd.

Jack was a very well-trained canine. I had Jack for seven years on the street. Jack found lots of drugs, which led to seizures and assets for our department. Jack paid for himself over several times what's the department had to pay for him in seizures. Jack had numerous patrol deployments and bites and was very correct in training and technique. I also became a member of NAPWADA a police dog organization. I would go to Paris Tennessee once a year for a week for certification and practical scenario training. Out of 52 teams they allowed each year, Jack was the overall top patrol dog, the hardest hitting dog the last two years I took him. Thanks to the training that he had from Mose.

The third dog I have worked and I'm currently working is Bruce Lee. Another dog that Mose trained from a puppy. In just a few months of working on the street Bruce Lee has already had 18 calls for free air sniffs on vehicles for 6 different agencies, 14 of them ended in positive drug finds. Bruce Lee has nine patrol deployments, finding 3 hiding suspects and detaining 3, 2 surrendering when they see the K9 being deployed 1 had broken the sealed perimeter before the K9 arrived. Bruce Lee has had 2 article searches in the field and found lost items both times. Bruce Lee is making a tremendous dog; his obedience is spot on and his training in drugs and patrol work was very good when I got him. When I have went to Mose for training or recertification 's, our department gets more than their money's worth. If I go there for three days or two or three weeks at a time, Mose sets aside that time, and does nothing but work with my dog and me the duration of my stay. I've watched Mose work with people and dogs, and he does an incredible job of communicating with both. I would highly recommend if you need a service dog, a police dog or general obedience on your pet buying a dog or taking your current dog to Mose! He cares about his customers and his dogs.

I met Mose Huggis in 2011 at an American Working Dog Council K9 Workshop in Salem, Illinois. I had never heard of Mose before, upon meeting him we started talking about how I was having problems getting my K9 to bark at suspects. Mose then told me he could get the dog to bark, not even knowing how my partner was. In a short amount of time, approximately 10 minutes, he was able to get my dog barking upon command. During this workshop I was also conducting detection dog certifications, as I was the Vice President and certifying official at that time. He had brought a couple German Shepherds that were trained as narcotics/patrol dogs. While watching Mose with these dogs I was amazed at how well he worked with his K9's. He later told me these two dogs were his first attempt at training detection dogs.

In all the time I have known Mose he has always been available to help me with K9 decoy work when needed. He has an amazing ability to understand the K9's behavior and how to explain to the handler the proper techniques to working the dog. There has been several times where I have not been able to get a handler to understand a technique, I then contact Mose, and he will either drive to my area for training or wait until a workshop and get the K9 teams working like they should.

During the last few years of knowing Mose I have had the privilege of certifying several K9's that he has trained in detection work. During several of our discussion in the beginning he had told me that he was new to detection work, he and I have talked several times about training techniques to improve the detection ability of our K9's. He has always been willing to take criticism about training techniques and has also helped me with some of the newer handlers.

Premiere Police Trainer Teaches K-9s New Tricks

Officers, dogs, practice tactics at local workshop

Huggis was one of select few in the state who was allowed to attend training camp put on by Germany's Andreas Prickel, who trains military and police (logs all over Europe). Prickel has come to the United States for the first time to train Kansas K-9 units in the tactics used in Germany.



"This is your last warning," yelled Newton police officer Tony Hawpe, crouching down to release his dog from its leash. The Dutch shepherd, who had looked friendly just a moment ago, sprinted across the lawn Friday and leaped at Mosc Huggis, biting into his arm. After a few seconds, Hawpe commanded the dog to stand down, and it laid in the grass obediently, still watching its former target. Thankfully for Huggis, this was just a drill, and his forearm was protected by a large, padded sleeve made especially for the purpose.

Hawpe and Huggis, professional dog trainers, were participants at a tactical police service dog seminar, a workshop that aimed to teach better skill levels for police dogs.

"It's a new concept developed by the German special forces," said Tom Brenneman, the organizer.

Brenneman, a retired police officer from Newton, spent his career working with K-9 units, training them to search dangerous areas, sniff out illegal drugs and even detect explosives.

Brenneman heard about the work of Andreas Preckel, a renowned canine trainer and German police commissioner who has taught his techniques throughout Europe, through friends that he had in Germany. Brenneman was determined to have him share his experience with officers in the United States, and he eventually set up the training workshop, which has taken place over the past two weeks at a site near Forbes Field.

Although Preckel wasn't allowed to speak to the media, Brenneman said it would "help keep police officers alive" in dangerous situations, especially those in which the police must search buildings to find a lurking criminal. He said Preckel's ideas would take Kansas' K-9 units to the next level.

"I've been working with dogs 32 years, and I'm learning so much stuff," he said.

What sets Preckel's approach apart is the focus on having officers control the dogs through respect, not fear.

"(The exercises) aren't about punishment," said retired federal police officer Bryon Dills, who was looking on at the workshop Friday. "It's about harnessing the dog's natural drive."

"The dogs have so much control, they actually work with the tactical team," Brenneman said.

That teamwork is especially important when police are searching for a hidden criminal — "everything from a bad guy in a building to a bad guy with a knife," he said.

This is Preckel's first visit to America, and the course was extremely popular. Brenneman even had to turn away some applicants, since the training works best for small groups. Later this summer, he said he is planning a similar workshop for Kansas law enforcement students.
